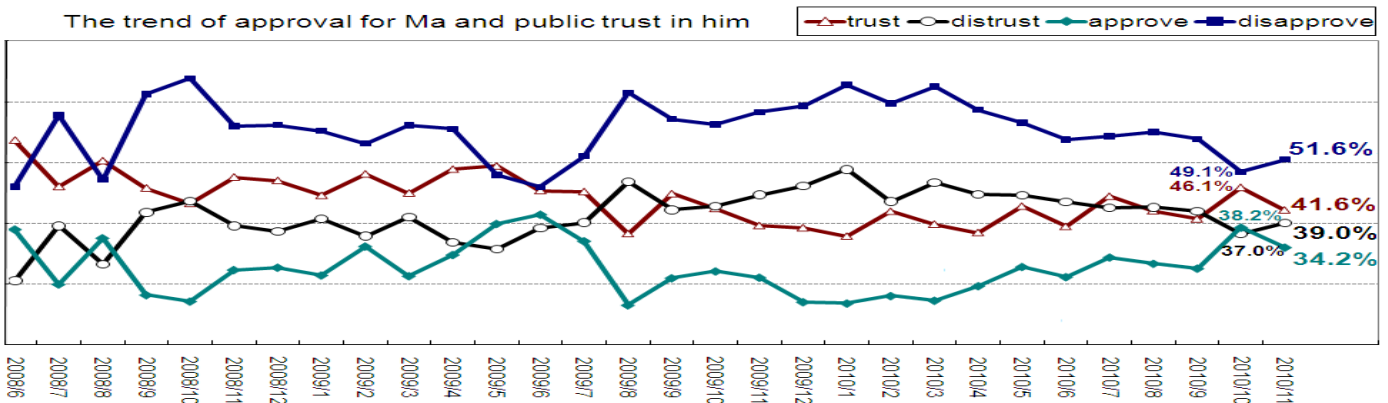


**Survey on the Approval Rating of President Ma Ying-jeou and His Administration**

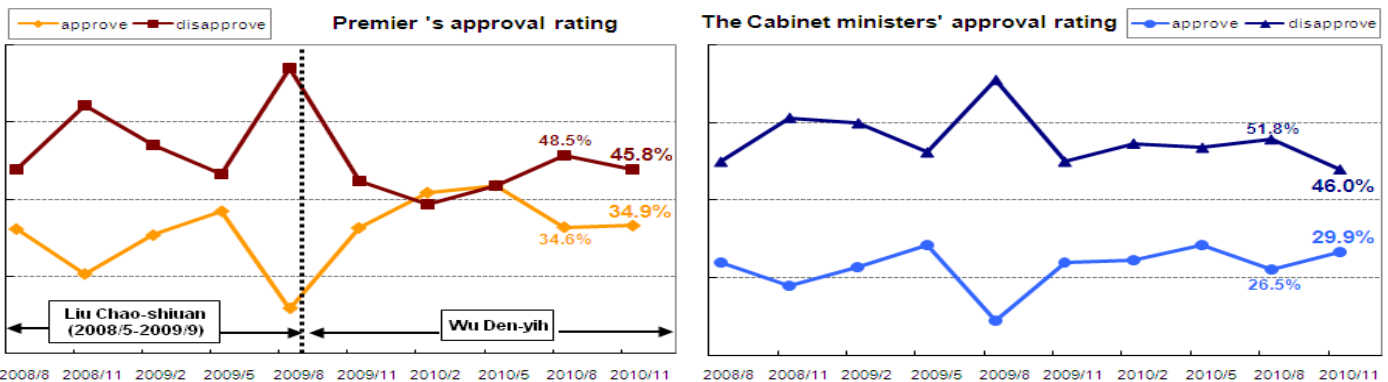
**A. President Ma's performance: 41.6 percent of the polled trusted him while 39 percent distrusted. 34.2 percent were satisfied with Ma's performance but 51.6 percent were not.**

According to the poll, 34.2 percent of the respondents were satisfied with Ma's performance while 51.6 percent said otherwise. Compared with last month, Ma's approval rating dropped 4 percentage points and disapproval rating climbed 2.5 percentage points. As for the public trust on Ma, 41.6 percent of people said they trusted the president but 39 percent did not. Ma's public trust rating slipped 4.5 percentage points and distrust rating went up by 2 percentage points.



**B. 34.9 percent of the interviewed were content with the performance of Premier Wu Den-yi but 45.8 percent were not. 29.9 percent of people were satisfied with the cabinet members' performance while 46 percent were not.**

GVSRC has been conducting the quarterly survey on the performance of the premier and his cabinet members. The poll indicated 34.9 percent of people were satisfied with Premier Wu Den-yi's performance while 45.8 percent were not. Wu's approval rating climbed 0.3 percentage points and disapproval rating fall 2.7 percentage points in comparison with the previous quarter. 29.9 percent of the people were content with the cabinet members' performance while 46 percent said otherwise. Compared with the last quarter, the cabinet members' approval rating advanced 3.4 percentage points and disapproval rating dropped 5.8 percentage points.



**C. 26.4 percent of the people were satisfied with KMT lawmakers' performance but 53.1 percent said otherwise.**

KMT controls nearly 70 percent of seats and shares the dominating power in the Legislative Yuan. The regular poll found that 53.1 percent of the respondents were not satisfied with the overall performance of the KMT legislators with only 26.4 percent were satisfied with their performance. Compared with last month, their approval rating increased by 2.8 percentage points and disapproval rating went down by 2 percentage points.

This survey was conducted by GVSRC from 6.20 p.m. to 10.00 p.m. from November 14 to 16, 2010. It was conducted with random-digit-dial sampling and computer-assisted telephone interviewing methods. 1002 Taiwanese people who are 20 or older completed the interview. One can say with 95% confidence level that the margin of error is ±3.1%. Gender, living areas, ages, and educational level of the interviewees have undergone weighting procedure and test of the sample's representativeness in the survey results.
